On the Eastern Caribbean Securities Market today, 500 BON traded at \$5.50 up twenty-five cents or 4.76%, 250 DES shares traded at \$2.95 down five cents or 1.67% on its previous price and 50 RBGL shares traded at \$55.26 unchanged from its previous market close.

Also, The Government of Saint Lucia's 6-year, \$40 million bond issue, auctioned on the Regional Government Securities Market using the primary market platform of the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange was over-subscribed by 3.405%. A non-competitive uniform fixed price auction methodology was used at an interest rate of 7.15% per cent.

And today's financial tip:

If I have a joint account can one holder be designated to act on behalf of the other holders?

Yes, one holder of a joint account can be given the power to act on behalf of the other holders of the account. For this person to take control of the account all the holders of the account must complete and sign a copy of the ECCSR's Primary Person Designation form. The completed form should be certified by a notary public or a broker dealer or be accompanied by a certified copy of a power of attorney prior to being submitted to the ECCSR.
