On the Eastern Caribbean Securities Market today, 400 East Caribbean Financial Holding Company shares traded at \$12.50 a decrease of ninety-eight cents or 7.27 per cent on its last traded price. 1,970 St Kitts Nevis Anguilla National Bank shares traded at a high of \$2.48 and at a low of \$2.47 closing at \$2.48.

Also, 21 East Caribbean Financial Holding Company shares traded odd lot at a price of \$12.50.

On the Regional Government Securities Market, the Government of St Vincent and the Grenadines' \$20.0 million 91-day Treasury bill issue was auctioned on the primary platform of the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange was oversubscribed by \$23.003 million. A competitive uniform price auction methodology was used and the resulting discount rate was 4.00%.

How will I know the balance on my account after I have successfully bought shares?

After a successful trade the broker will inform the buying investor of his success. Shortly after settlement on the following day, the broker will transfer the securities into the investors' account. The Eastern Caribbean Central Securities Registry records the activity and mails out an account activity statement the morning after the transfer. The statement provides details of the transfer and the new account balance.
